Students are not to be in the building before 7:30 a.m. and should not be in the halls during lunch without permission from a teacher or administrator. Drinks are not to be brought back from lunch and put in lockers. No food or drinks are allowed in the hallways. Cell phones are not to be used in the building. This includes the cafeteria.

Public displays of affection, other than holding hands, are not appropriate in school or at school events. Students should demonstrate respect for themselves and others by conducting themselves in a manner appropriate for public places. The administration expects students to follow these guidelines.

Coats, hats, book bags and large purses must be placed in lockers upon arrival at school and must stay there until time to exit the building.

No person shall harass or intimidate another student based upon a student's sex, color, race, religion, physical or mental disability, or sexual orientation. Examples of prohibited conduct include name-calling, using derogatory slurs, or wearing or possessing items that imply prejudice. The District will not tolerate harassing or intimidating conduct in any form. (Board policy 7:20)

Students are expected to place their food wrappers, trays, plastic knives and forks, and drink containers in one of the 30 garbage barrels in the Commons! Students' cooperation is needed and expected.
